

Why do Fellowship Groups meet?

Colossians 2:6-7 says: "...just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness."

With this in mind, the goal of Fellowship Groups is to grow in faith, learning to live with Christ as our Lord in every area of our lives.

What do Fellowship Groups do?

So that we can encourage one another to live with Christ as Lord, Bible study and prayer are at the heart of the group meetings, along with plenty of time to get to know one another better (usually over coffee and cake!) and share our lives together.

When do Fellowship Groups meet?

Most groups meet on Wednesday evening.

There are also groups meeting:

- Tuesday morning (women)
- Tuesday afternoon
- Wednesday early morning
- Thursday evening

Once a month on a Wednesday evening (also Tuesday morning) we meet together as a church family for a Prayer Gathering.

Our Vision: Making Disciples of Jesus

Most of this term we will be 'Equipped to Serve', getting ourselves better equipped in prayerfully speaking God's word in various situations. There will be six sessions in our Fellowship Groups followed by one central session where we meet all together at Church. Then either side of Easter there will be two Bible studies, one focusing on Jesus' death and the other on his resurrection.

Equipped to Serve

As a church family we want to be "Equipped to Serve" the Lord, each other and our community. Fellowship Groups have a part to play in that: this term we will be getting ourselves better equipped in prayerfully speaking God's word in various situations. Each of our Fellowship Groups will work through one of three DVD-based courses: Six Steps to Loving Your Church, Six Steps to Talking About Jesus, Six Steps to Reading Your Bible. As the names suggest, there will be six sessions in our Fellowship Groups followed by one central session where we meet all together at Church for a number of different sessions which you will be able to sign up for later in term. Then either side of Easter there will be two Bible studies, one focusing on Jesus' death and the other on his resurrection. Let's pray that the Lord equips us to serve him through these different elements of our Fellowship Group programme.
