Sermon notes

Our God punishes sin

Jeremiah 39

The story so far

After David and Solomon come a succession of kings who led the people astray.

God gives numerous warnings of judgment through prophets like Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah.

The kingdom is divided, Israel taken into exile, Judah becomes a vassal state of Assyria.

626 BC: King Josiah finds the forgotten book of Law, makes reforms, purging idolatry.

627 BC: God's word first comes to Jeremiah (Jer.1), but despite Josiah's protection, there is still huge opposition to his message. By now, Babylonians under Nebuchadnezzar have overtaken the Assyrians as the dominant power.

609 Josiah succeeded by his sons who turn away from God: Jehoahaz (taken off to Egypt after 3 months), and Johoiakim, ruled for 11 years before being taken off to Babylon.

Johoiakim succeeded by his son Johoiachin, also taken off to Babylon after 3 months.

598: Zedekiah (Jehoiachin's uncle) installed by Babylonians as puppet king but he rebels, despite Jeremiah's warnings from God to surrender.

Jan 588: Jerusalem besieged by Babylonians and falls in July 587 (2 Kings 25, Jer.39).

The Message of Jeremiah 39 (and 31-38)

1. Jeremiah continues to speak God's message faithfully, however unpopular and whatever the cost (Jer.34-38)

2. God fulfils what he planned: punishment for disobedience and idolatry (Jer.39:1-10)

3. But God has not abandoned his promise to Abraham, Moses, David (Rom.11): this punishment is for their ultimate good – to bring them back to him. There is a promise of restoration, a new covenant and a new heart (Jer.31 and 33)

4. God provides rescue to those who trust in him (Jer.39:11-18).
